## Wilmington Pike Construction Update

The contractor is removing the traffic medians on Wilmington Pike north and south of Whipp Road intersection today and tomorrow (7/28-7/29) in preparation for the next phase of construction. This removal will allow traffic to be shifted east during the next two phases of construction and maintains two thru lanes during most of the construction. This shift should occur in the next 1-2 weeks. The median removal will affect traffic on Wilmington Pike at Whipp Road/ Feedwire Road:

### **Southbound(SB)**

The SB left turn lane onto Feedwire Road will be shifted into a SB thru-lane during the workday. The SB thru-traffic will be shifted into the far right lane, and limited to one lane during the workday.

### **Northbound(NB)**

The NB left turn lane to Whipp Road will be limited to one left turn lane during the workday.

### **Loon under construction**

Work on the Loon, on the west side of Wilmington Pike at Brown Road, begins construction today and continues through August 12. A Loon will allow northbound traffic to make a legal U-turn. The Loon construction will affect traffic on southbound Wilmington Pike at Brown Road.

### **Southbound (SB)**

The traffic will be limited to one SB thru-lane at Brown Road during construction, which is estimated at 1-2 weeks.

### **Additional work around Wilmington Pike and Whipp Road**

- Montgomery County Environmental Services will be working on water lines in the area south of Whipp Road, but should not affect traffic.
- Dayton Power and Light will be working near the intersection of Whipp Road and Wilmington Pike on underground power lines, but should not affect traffic.
- Construction will move into the Wilmington Pike and Whipp Road Intersection area over the next 1-2 weeks, mainly concentrated on the northwest corner(Speedway) for approximately a month.
